This self-reflective autoenthnography investigates, examines, analyzes, and critiques Lolita-like or eroticized girl representations in popular visual media. Beginning with Vladimir Nabokov's *Lolita* (1955), my discourse analysis investigates sociocultural contexts regarding tacit beliefs about *Lolita*, examines issues of authority, critiques Lolita-like representations, and questions mythic narratives ascribed to eroticized girls. Additionally, I argue for curriculum development that empowers and encourages agency for student populations. Chair: Dr. Terry Barrett.
