- **CSCC General Education Requirements:** Students should choose the General Education courses for the AA degree in consultation with their academic and faculty advisors.
- **CSCC Degree Plan:** This Sample Graduation Plan was created with the assumption that students would complete the Studio Art Bachelor's Degree Transfer Major before transferring into the stated bachelor's degree. Completing the general Associate of Arts degree is also an option and this document can still be used for degree planning. - **OSU General Education Requirements:** How a student completes these requirements will vary, depending on how he or she chose to complete the General Education requirements at Columbus State. Any General Education requirements not completed at Columbus State will need to be completed at Ohio State. Elective course work, if selected appropriately, can be used to pursue a minor. Students should consult with an academic advisor in the department of the intended major to discuss optimal course selections for General Education, effective choice of electives, and appropriate course selections in the major. Students can find the list of Arts and Sciences advisors by major, including contact information, at <https://artsandsciences.osu.edu/academics/programs>
- Students pursuing the BA must take a minimum of 10 semester hours of Natural Science course work, with at least one course in the Physical Sciences, at least one course in the Biological Sciences, and at least one course with a laboratory component. Most students will take a minimum of three Natural Science courses to fulfill the 10 hour minimum.
- Students must take at least two courses in the Social Sciences; the two courses must not be from the same General Education subcategory. See the latest Arts and Sciences BA curriculum sheet for more details.
- For the Literature and Arts categories, no more than one course across the two categories can be from the area of the major. For the Social Science category, no more than one course can be from the area of the major. The GE Literature, Arts, and Social Science courses cannot be counted as part of the major.
- All programs in the College of Arts and Sciences require a minimum of 121 semester hours, including a minimum of 39 hours at or above the 3000 level.
- ****OSU Art Education Major:** The Bachelor of Art Education degree has two options for students- one leading to licensure in Visual Arts PK-12 in the State of Ohio and the other, an informal option that is for student seeking opportunities outside of licensure. This plan is for students seeking licensure. Students interested in the Informal option should contact the OSU BAE Academic Advisor. Students are required to meet the General Education course work for Bachelor of Arts degrees at OSU for this degree. For the Studio Art Bachelor's Degree Transfer Major, students must complete ART 1205, 1206, 1207, 2221, 2275, 2230, and 2294 with HART 1201 and 1202. HART 1201 and 1202 are required art history courses for the major and will count toward the general education degree. ART 1206, 1206, and 1207; ENGL 1100; and PSY 2200 are part of the major foundation and degree courses and students must earn a "C" or higher in these courses for them to count toward the Art Education (BAE) major. ART 2221 and 2275 will count as required major foundation elective courses must also be completed with a grade of "C" or higher. ART 2230 and 2295 will count as electives toward the degree at OSU. Students who are interested in this degree should contact the OSU BAE academic advisor as soon as possible to keep up with degree and admission requirements
- *****Admission to BAE Major Coursework:** Admission to the BAE major is competitive. Students are encouraged to contact OSU Art Education as soon as possible in their first year at CSCC to begin degree and admissions planning. CSCC students bound for BAE will apply to the major prior to graduation. Deadline for application to the degree program is March 1. Students will be notified of their admission status mid-year and will begin their BAE licensure course work in the autumn. Students will be required to submit a portfolio as part of the application process. FOTO 1140: Students should take FOTO 1140 as part of their AA-Studio Arts Bachelor's Degree Major to satisfy additional OSU major requirements.
