THE SCHWARTZ SCHOLARSHIP IN ARTS MANAGEMENT

The Barbara Strutin Schwartz and Stanley Schwartz Scholarship Fund for Arts Management was established in 2019, and funds scholarships intended to recognize merit and academic promise of students in the Arts Management program in the Department of Arts Administration, Education & Policy at The Ohio State University. First preference shall be given to diverse candidates seeking a career in community arts organizations. In addition, applicants must have junior or senior standing, should demonstrate a strong understanding for the role of arts programming and its possible impact on communities. A GPA of 3.0 or higher is expected. The recipients will be chosen by the Undergraduate Studies Committee in consultation with AM faculty. Your award will be applied to your OSU Bursar's account the semester it is awarded. Applicants should be aware that current or future financial aid arrangements may be affected by receipt of this award.

To apply, you should submit:

- 1. This application form.
- 2. A two-page essay that addresses your personal passion for community arts programming (fine arts, dance, music, theatre or other arts-related programming), including the reasons you plan to pursue a career in arts management. How do you hope to impact community through opportunities in the arts? The essay should be typed and double-spaced. It will be judged on its quality of thought and expression, as well as the quality of the ideas expressed.
- 3. A resume, which briefly lists education, employment, honors and awards, and other accomplishments or affiliations that might indicate your abilities, determination, and potential.
- 4. Copy of your most recent OSU Advising Report. In addition, if you have transferred to OSU from another university, a copy of the transcript from that institution and all other colleges and universities that you have attended.

<u>DEADLINE</u>: You should submit the application form, essay, vita, and transcript in an envelope no later than <u>Friday</u>, <u>October 21</u>, <u>2023</u>. Applications should be submitted at 1813 High Street, Sullivant Hall, Columbus, Ohio, 43210 to the Undergraduate Studies Committee, C/O Dr. Shari Savage. Awards will be announced in November.
